Fund Positioning

 ${\sf HDFC}$ Low Duration Fund is a low duration debt scheme that focuses on investing in debt securities and money market instruments such that the Macaulay Duration of the portfolio is between 6 and 12 months. Currently, the Scheme focuses on developing a well-diversified portfolio of debt (including securitised debt) and other instruments that aims to generate returns commensurate with low levels of interest rate risk.

Investment Objective

To generate income/capital appreciation through investment in debt securities and money market instruments. There is no assurance that the investment objective of the Scheme will be achieved.

#Macaulay Duration (Duration) measures the price volatility of fixed income securities. It is often used in the comparison of interest rate risk between securities with different coupons and different maturities. It is defined as the weighted average time to cash flows of a bond where the weights are nothing but the present value of the cash flows themselves. It is expressed in years/days. The duration of a fixed income security is always shorter than its term to maturity, except in the case of zero coupon securities where they are the same.


